Happy New Year colleagues and friends!

The Victorian Deaf Education Institute (VDEI) remains steadfastly committed to inclusive, transformative education for children and young people who are deaf or hard of hearing in Victoria.

VDEI's 2016 Professional Learning Program achieved one hundred percent of its targets. Almost 4,200 hours of professional learning was received by more than 870 participants with government schools the largest recipients of the learning. The sector's 2016 preferred learning modality was via 2-hour twilight sessions

VDEI's 2017 Professional Learning Program has been strategically planned to support school professionals and allied health practitioners serving children and young people who are deaf or hard of hearing and their families in Victoria. Learning opportunities were informed through four streams of evidence: 1) post event evaluations, 2) online learning needs analysis survey, 3) focus groups, and 4) peer-reviewed journal articles. I am confident that you will find a professional learning opportunity to suit your needs.
