In2School: Supporting school refusing students to return to school

On-Demand Presentation



Dr Lisa McKay-Brown provides an overview of her innovative intervention program, In2School: Supporting School Refusing Students. School refusers are students who experience severe difficulty attending classes and demonstrate a reluctance and often outright refusal to go to school.

Dr McKay-Brown's on-demand presentation will discuss the In2School approach, a wraparound approach for school refusers which brings teachers and clinicians together for up to six consecutive months. During this time, the support team assesses, plans and implements needs-based, personalised programs for each young person at home, in the clinic and in the classroom.

Learning Outcomes

Participants will develop an understanding of:

- Early warning signs for school refusal and how schools can help identify these
- Interventions for school refusal
- The importance of using multidisciplinary teams for school refusal interventions
- How a wraparound model of care can be used as part of tier 3 interventions to support students who are school refusing in school settings.
